

Educational requirement to sell at the Meat Animal Sale at the Richland County Fair:

Must attend one Pig Project meeting AND complete the YQCA (Youth for the Quality Care of Animals) certification.

YQCA Certificates are due to the Extension Office by 4:30 p.m. on July 23rd

Youth may substitute one of the following as a replacement for attendance at a Pig Project meeting

-Show Pig Association Spring Symposium

-Participation in Wisconsin 4-H Meats Judging, Skillathon, Livestock Quiz Bowl or Livestock Judging Contest.

ANIMAL SCIENCE

All Richland County 4-H members enrolled in the Beef, Dairy, Goats, Poultry, Rabbits, Sheep and Pig projects are encouraged to complete the YQCA program. "Youth for the Quality Care of Animals" (YQCA), is an interactive program that reinforces current animal industry best practices. It was developed and funded by national livestock industry professionals, extension specialists and livestock show managers. YQCA replaces Wisconsin's Meat Animal Quality Assurance (MAQA) program.



Course content includes an age appropriate module from each of the following areas:

- Animal Welfare (basic needs, proper animal handling, biosecurity, etc.).
- Food Safety (medications, medicated feeds, withdrawal times, avoiding residue, etc.).
- Character Education (ethics, goal setting, career exploration, etc.).

YQCA certification is available online at www.yqca.org. Fee: \$12/exhibitor/year Annual certification should take approximately 60 minutes. After viewing each module, the exhibitor will take a quiz which demonstrates content mastery. Additional information about YQCA is available at <https://fyi.uwex.edu/youthlivestock/yqca/>



NEW FOR 2018! The Wisconsin State Fair will be requiring YQCA certification for all youth who exhibit animal projects (Beef, Dairy, Goats, Poultry, Rabbits, Sheep and Swine) at the 2018 Wisconsin State Fair Junior Shows. Youth wishing to exhibit must provide his/her YQCA certification number when entering by the entry deadline on June 6, 2018. Youth who do not provide a YQCA certification number, or did not pass the YQCA modules for the current calendar year will not be eligible to participate in the 2018 Wisconsin State Fair Junior Shows.






FOODS
