Tomatoes & Salsa: Wednesday, August 17

Tomatoes are the mostly widely home-canned product in the United States, but to avoid spoilage and the risk of food poisoning, it's important to follow a tested - and updated! - recipe. There are so many ways to process garden tomatoes that the varieties are almost endless. This session will focus on making homemade salsa, while also providing plenty of recipes for other types of tomato products. **Register by August 11th.**
