



2023 Richland County 4-H Scholarship

Sponsored by the Richland County 4-H Leaders Association



Criteria

- Current Richland County 4-H member or alumni
- Current high school senior or college freshman
- Planning to or currently attending a two or four year program
- Students are not eligible to receive the scholarship more than once.

Application Requirements

Application materials submitted can be returned to the candidates once the selection has been completed.

- Cover Letter
- Resume (include 4-H involvement)
- Most involved or completed 4-H Record Book within the past two (2) years
- Leadership Skills Essay Question: *"How has 4-H helped you prepare for your future?"*
- Proof of acceptance to a post-secondary school
- Two letters of recommendation (*one 4-H reference and one non-4-H reference letter*)

Amount

- Will be based on the funds available each year, but not less than \$250. The number of recipients will be determined by the Richland County 4-H Leaders Board of Directors.

Application Submission

- Applications must be postmarked by **March 1**.
- Submit completed application to the Richland County 4-H Leaders Association, UW-Extension Office, 1000 Highway 14 West, Richland Center, WI 53581.

Selection

- Applicants will be interviewed by a selection committee consisting of representatives from the Richland County 4-H Leader Board, community members and youth leaders.

Notification

- Selection will be made prior to scholarship ceremonies at local high schools.

Requirements for receiving scholarship

- Must be enrolled as a full time student in an accredited college for at least two (2) semesters.
- Requests for scholarship funds can be made after the first semester. When requesting a check, you will need to provide the following:
 - Transcript from first semester with a GPA of 2.0 or better, or the equivalent
 - Proof of registration for next semester
